Begin your day at the highest public vantage point in the southern hemisphere, the Eureka Skydeck. Before you can begin the race you must name the following famous Melbourne landmarks and provide one fact about each.

Clue: Use the red scrolling LED screens located on the floor.

250 points



I was the first steel bridge over the Yarra River forming a link between the city and Port Melbourne, where thousands of immigrants first landed on Australian shores. Built in 1888, my \$18.5M redevelopment includes the magnificent sculptures -

The Travellers - a series of giant steel sculptures, depicting the waves of immigrants who journeyed to make Melbourne their home.

Take a team photo with one of the travellers.



100 bonus points

Provide the names of all traveller sculptures and what period they represent.



Connecting Little Collins Street to the Bourke Street Mall in the Royal Arcade, I am the home of Gog and Magog. These two 7-foot giants have been striking the time every hour on Gaunt's clock

since 1842. To be awarded the 250 points **your entire group must have a video of you taken when the clock is being struck.**



The main stadium for the 1956 Olympic Games, and the 2006 Commonwealth Games, I was named as one of the "7 Wonders of the Sporting World" in January 2009. Home to Australia's AFL Grand finale; **have your group photo taken with either Ron**

Barassi, Donald Bradman or Betty Cuthbert.

Each weekday, over 110,000 commuters and 1,500 trains pass through my station, I am one of Melbourne's most easily recognisable landmarks and sit opposite one of its most controversial. I am a famous meeting spot for many Melbournians.

Have your team photo taken at my famous meeting point.



Over the last 200 years, people seeking a better life, or to escape conflict in their home have journeyed to settle in Australia. In this building customs officers recorded all goods entering or leaving

Victoria; also controlled immigration, recorded every arrival, and administered a White Australia Policy that excluded immigrants on the basis of their race. Beautifully restored in 1998, this building is now the home to a museum.

Find me and collect an information booklet or brochure from inside.



The site of where over 135 people were hanged, including the bushranger Ned Kelly. Today's tour times are listed on a board outside the entrance.

What am I and what is the last tour listed for today?



Covering over 38 hectares in Melbourne and home to the Governors House, I have over 50,000 plants and am one of the world's finest gardens. **Take a video of one or more of your team mates doing a cartwheel on the grass.**

If you can get the governor's house in the background.

Built in 1861, I hold some of Melbourne's most memorable exhibits and I am a popular attraction for tourists and Melburnians alike. Located on St Kilda Rd my entrance is surrounded by water.

Walk behind my famous water wall and take a photo of your group on the outside.



The Sanctuary is the heart of the Shrine where thousands pay their respects to service men and women each year. The Stone of Remembrance, in the centre of the Sanctuary, is symbolic of a gravestone for those Victorian Service men and women buried overseas and in unmarked graves.

What is the Biblical inscription located on the Stone of Remembrance?

Find this plaque located around the shrine and finish the sentence:

'To the glory of service and sacrifice this shrine was dedicated by.....'



This major Melbourne landmark is said to be the largest open air market in the Southern Hemisphere. Named after Queen Victoria, the market offers a variety of fruit and vegetables, meat, poultry, seafood and deli foods as well as specialty delicacies. It also has a large non-food related market, selling a diverse range of clothing, shoes, jewellery and handmade art and crafts. **What letter sheds are the fruits and vegetables located in?**

75 points



This cottage originally stood in the village of Great Ayton in the county of Yorkshire, and was shipped and rebuilt in the picturesque Fitzroy Gardens to commemorate the voyages of Captain James Cook. It stands as the oldest building in Australia, head to the gardens and **find out when it was constructed.**

One of the greatest attractions for children is situated in the Fitzroy Gardens - Ola Cohn's Fairies Tree, comprising a series of lovely carvings on the stump of one of the original Red Gum trees in the Fitzroy Gardens, well over 300 years in age. **Take a photo with 'The Fairies Tree'.**



Serving as a famous landmark on the corner of Swanston Street, some use me as a clock as my bells echo through the city every hour. Built on the site of the first Christian service in Melbourne the building has three spires on top which were added 35 years after the building was completed. **Take a video that includes all members of your team while the bells are singing.**



I am the building which houses the decision-makers of our state.
How many steps lead up to my front door?



Catch classics of Australian cinema, explore the special exhibitions or create your own short film. ACMI brings the world of the moving image to life with hands-on workshops, live panel forums, exhibitions and screenings. **Located on the corner of Flinders St and Swanston St what does ACMI stand for?**

My name means 'river of mists' and 'river bank', and host a number of famous events in Melbourne. I house a number of famous permanent structures, including 'The Angel' and Federation Bells. **What is my name?**

Take a photo with 'The Angel'



I am located under the Flinders Street railway bridge and designed to replicate a ship moored to a river. I extend 7 meters below water level and am split over 4 levels. Home to over 10,000 aquatic creatures my latest residents originated from Antarctica. **Find me and collect an information booklet or brochure from inside.**

50 points



Located on the corner of Swanston and La Trobe Streets, I not only hold a vast collection of books, you can also visit my galleries, listen to music, watch films and play games. In front of the main steps is an imposing statue of Judge Barry, the judge who sentenced Ned Kelly to death. **What is Judge Barry's first name?**



50 bonus points

What year is represented in Roman Numerals on his statue?



Formerly known as Spencer St Station, my large curved roof is a famous site, regional travellers leave here by day and night.

What platforms do the regional trains depart from?



Melbourne has a rich multicultural heritage and celebrates the different traditions, cuisines and cultures that have settled in the city. Experience multicultural Melbourne by visiting one of its best areas located on Little Bourke St. **Have your photo taken by one of the 5 key arches located between Swanston St and Exhibition St.**

Additional Bonus points



Inspiring art is everywhere in Melbourne - hidden in nooks and crannies, over, under and around street corners and right where you'd never expect to find it. **10 points will be awarded for a photo for every public artwork you can find.**

(Cannot be associated with another answer) Note: One team member must be in the photo with the public artwork – **10 points per photo**



The Eureka Tower is a residential building with over 500 apartment and home to 1,500 people. Installed near the entrance is home to a colony of giant gold insects which represent the community within the tower.

What are the insects and how many are there?
